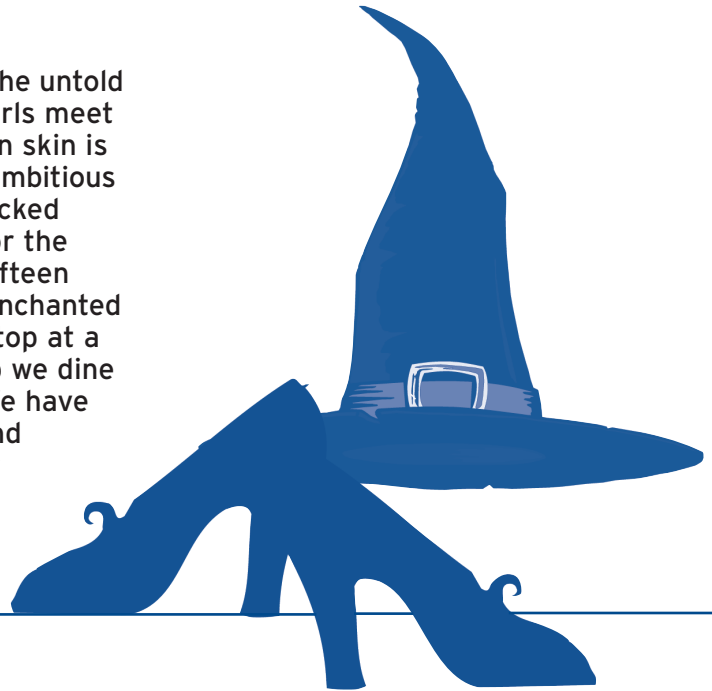

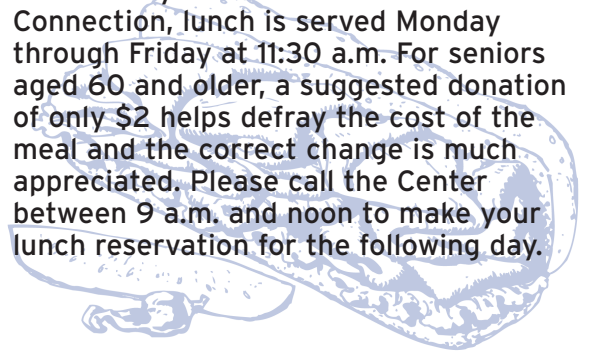

Please bring a copy of last year's tax records, all applicable state and federal forms, W-2s, 1099s and non-taxable interest income documents. All income (including interest) and expense information is needed to complete the forms. This service is not appropriate for preparing complicated returns. Please contact the Center on or after January 29 for your appointment.

Blood Pressure Management

Winter Delays & Closings

When Miamisburg City Schools are closed due to winter weather conditions, then all morning programs (8 a.m. - noon) are cancelled. A decision will be made by noon regarding afternoon programs (noon - 4 p.m.) and by 4 p.m. for evening programs (4 - 9 p.m.). In the event Miamisburg City Schools are on a weather-related one or two hour delay, the Center will follow the schools' scheduled openings.
